

Minutes of Meeting
Juvenile Probation Monthly Discussion
November 2, 2015
8:30 a.m.

The Kootenai County Board of Commissioners: Chairman Pro Tem Marc Eberlein, and Commissioner David Stewart met to discuss the following agenda items. Also present were Juvenile Probation Director Debbie Nadeau and Deputy Clerk Alicia Lynch. Chairman Dan Green was excused.

- A. Call to Order:** Chairman Pro Tem Marc Eberlein called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.
- B. Introductions:** There were no introductions.

- D. Business:**

County Annual Juvenile Justice Report to Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections (IDJC) review and approval

Juvenile Probation Director Debbie Nadeau presented a statistical report to the Board. She explained this report was due November 15, 2015, to the IDJC. She stated the report shows the number of cases supervised by Juvenile Probation and categorizes them by age, race, and gender. She requested the Board sign the report and added that it also required First Judicial District Administrative Judge Lansing Haynes' signature before being returned to the IDJC.

Commissioner David Stewart moved to approve the report provided by Juvenile Probation as presented, from October 1, 2014, to September 30, 2015. Chairman Pro Tem Eberlein seconded the motion. There being no further discussion, Deputy Clerk Lynch called the roll:

Commissioner Stewart: Aye
Chairman Pro Tem Eberlein: Aye
Chairman Green: Excused
The motion carried.

Juvenile Justice Programs Update: Coeur d'Alene School District-Student Threat Assessment and Management System & My Choice Panel

Ms. Nadeau explained the Student Threat Assessment and Management System and how Juvenile Probation participated in the program. She stated that the program was for acts of violence or implied threats but that none of the cases brought forward have been dire. She added that Juvenile Probation was involved with the school district on two to three cases per month to help with screening the incidents and determine what actions needed to be taken.

Ms. Nadeau explained the My Choice Panel was a quarterly event with speakers, primarily victims and offenders, discussing drinking and drug related incidents. She

provided an example of a young man who while intoxicated got into a car accident resulting in the death of a friend and how he speaks about the consequences he still faces years later. She added that they surveyed the youth in attendance afterwards and got positive responses. She explained that real people with real stories make a bigger impact than just telling kids that drugs are bad.

Behavioral Health Board- Juvenile Justice Representative: Paper Tigers documentary screening at the KROC Center

Ms. Nadeau discussed the documentary screening of Paper Tigers at the KROC Center. She explained the film deals primarily with trauma informed care, dealing with stress and uncertainty, how it impacts youth behavior, and actions adults can take to help. She stated a total of 568 people came to view the documentary. She explained that the screening was geared towards adults dealing with troubled youth and provided a flier detailing the agencies invited to the viewing.

Juvenile Justice Center Building

Ms. Nadeau explained that her talks with Prosecuting Attorneys Barry McHugh and Barry Black did not change their decision to move their juvenile programs out of the Juvenile Justice Center (JJC). She inquired if the Board had made any decisions concerning the move at this time.

Commissioner Stewart replied that no decisions had been made by the Board. He added that the Board would keep Ms. Nadeau informed on the talks regarding the JJC.

Chairman Pro Tem Eberlein added that he was not able to persuade the judges to provide a permanent juvenile judge. He did stress that it was the Board's priority to keep adults from being mixed with juveniles at the JJC.

- E. Public Comment:** This section is reserved for citizens wishing to address the Board regarding a County related issue. Idaho Law prohibits Board action on items brought under this section except in an emergency circumstance. Comments related to future public hearings should be held for that public hearing. There were no public comments.

Chairman Pro Tem Eberlein adjourned the meeting at 9:02 a.m.
